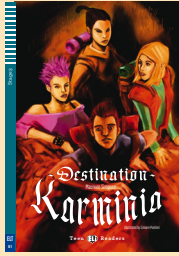

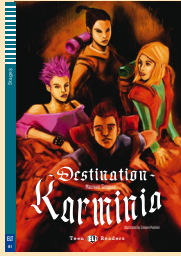

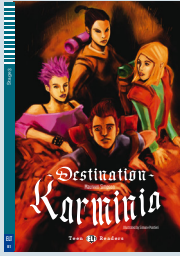

GAELIC AND ITS IMPORTANCE IN SCOTLAND

Although English remains the main language in Scotland, Gaelic is the founding one of this full-of-history Country. Originated in Ireland, it was considered the principle language of the medieval Kingdom of Alba.

However, in the late 18th century, the language was massively suppressed during the notorious Highland Clearances which followed the turbulent Jacobite rebellion. Although speakers of the language were oppressed over the centuries, Gaelic remains spoken in many parts of Scotland, from Glasgow and Inverness to the Outer Hebrides. Enrich by a rich heritage of music, folklore and cultural ecology, Gaelic is enjoying a revival and can be heard in Lowland pubs and at Hebridean ceillidhs. Tv series like Outlander have been influenced by the Gaelic language too.
