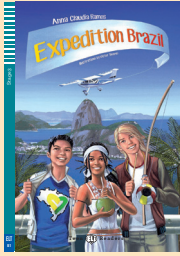

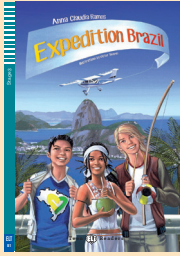

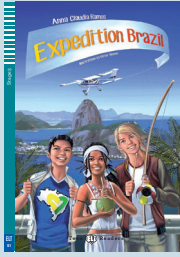

Focus on...

HOW MANY LANGUAGES ARE THERE IN BRAZIL?

Language is one of the most significant aspects of Brazil's national unity and identity. Portuguese is the official language of Brazil as it is spoken by almost 100 percent of the country's population. In spite of this, other important languages are spoken in Brazil, although by a small minority of the population. According to the 1940 Census, the most popular second language at the time was German. Although the percentage of German immigrants are less than the Italia one, people who speak German are more. That is because two-thirds of the children of German immigrants use German at home, while half of the children of Italians spoke Portuguese with their family.
