## Accommodation in the UK

The **Youth Hostels Association** (YHA) in England and Wales, non-profit and member of Hostelling International, is quite different to the original youth hostel model of budget, self-catering accommodation on bunk beds in large dormitories with shared bathrooms for young backpackers. Nowadays not only young travellers stay in YHA accommodation, but families, professionals and special interest groups. This is thanks to a wide range of modernised facilities and services such as: single and double rooms; extra shower and bathrooms; personal lockers; cycle storage; on-site parking and catering; games and activities rooms, with cheap or free entertainment; wi-fi, computer and meeting rooms. In addition, many hostels offer an outdoor activity focus like water sports, climbing or hiking as well as volunteer opportunities. There is even a scheme, enabling you to rent a whole hostel and stay there with a group of friends or family for an affordable celebration, short break or holiday.



At the other end of the scale, long-standing **deluxe British hotels** such as London's Dorchester and Claridge's present a wide range of services and facilities. These range from: babysitting and organised children's activities; all-day fine dining and traditional afternoon tea; a range of master classes; wedding, meeting and banqueting facilities and services; theatre desks; butler and chauffeuring services; hair and beauty treatments; spas and health clubs; in-room wi-fi, printers and scanners; individually-controlled air conditioning; four-poster beds in a choice of single or double rooms or luxury suites with private balconies and terraces. Prices are high to reflect the quality and quantity of services and facilities provided, so visitors tend to be wealthy tourists, VIPs or business clients. However, you can sometimes indulge yourself thanks to special offer spa or weekend breaks.
